# Mountain Ranger Battalion History

The history of the ROTC program at the University of Colorado Colorado Springs began in 1965 along with the founding of the college, although at this time it was not the host school. Colorado College was the host institution until unrest at the college forced the ROTC program to be moved. Soon after the ROTC program left Colorado College it was temporarily located at the University of Colorado Colorado Springs, until the University of Southern Colorado, now known as Colorado State University-Pueblo, became the host school.

Due to the increased possibilities for Army officers in the Colorado Springs area, the University of Colorado Colorado Springs applied for, and was granted, Host Institution status in 1981. In August 1983, the University of Colorado Colorado Springs ROTC Company was reorganized as a cadet battalion of two cadet companies and renamed the "Mountain Ranger Battalion." As of April 2024, the Mountain Ranger Battalion is made up of several schools, including the University of Colorado Colorado Springs, Colorado State University-Pueblo, The Colorado College, Pikes Peak State College and Colorado Technical University.

The Mountain Rangers have received high praise, being named the best trained ROTC Battalion in the nation in 1987, 1989, and 1999. The program was named the winner of the MacArthur Award in both 1990 and 1991, designating it as the "Best ROTC Battalion, Small College" in the nation. In October 2021, the Ranger Challenge Team brought home the first place trophy from the Regional Task Force Competition – the first time since 2014. Most recently for the 2022-2023 school year, the Mountain Rangers were designated as the "Best Medium Program, Army ROTC program in 5th Brigade, consisting of 36 programs across 8 states.

Whether the Mountain Rangers are climbing Pikes Peak, basking in the sun of White Sands, New Mexico at the Bataan Memorial Death March, playing intramural sports, or excelling at training events such as our FTXs and Advanced Camp, one thing is certain: the Mountain Rangers train in a challenging environment which produces high quality future Army warrior leaders.

# Guest Speaker Major General David Doyle



Major General David Doyle received his commission in the Infantry from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1993 with a Bachelor of Science in Military History. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College, the School of Advanced Military Studies, and the National War College in Washington, DC.

MG Doyle took command of 4th Infantry Division on 13 June 2023. His previous assignments include Chief of Staff of United States Central Command, Commanding General of the Joint Readiness Training Center and Fort Polk, Deputy Commanding General for Support of the 82nd Airborne Division; Director of Operations, CJ3, Combined Joint Task Force, Operation Inherent Resolve in Baghdad, Iraq;

Commander of Operations Group at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana; Chief of Staff of the 7th Infantry Division; Commander of the 2nd Infantry Brigade Combat Team "Commandos", 10th Mountain Division deployed in Kandahar, Afghanistan; Director of Operations, CJ3, for the NATO Special Operations Component Command – Afghanistan / Special Operations Joint Task Force – Afghanistan; Commander of the 2nd Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division; and company commander of Bravo Company, 3rd Ranger Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment and Bravo Company, 2-325th Airborne Infantry Regiment.

MG Doyle's awards and decorations include the Silver Star Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal with oak leaf cluster, Legion of Merit with four oak leaf clusters, Bronze Star Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Defense Meritorious Service Medal with oak leaf cluster, Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Joint Service Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters, and Army Achievement Medal. He has also earned the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal with arrowhead device, three Joint Meritorious Unit Awards, the Valorous Unit Award, the Afghan Campaign Ribbon with five service stars, the Iraq Campaign Ribbon with six service stars, the Operation Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal, the Humanitarian Assistance Award, the Armed Forces Services Medal, and the NATO Medal with bronze service star. MG Doyle earned the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Expert Infantryman's Badge, the Air Assault Badge, Master Parachutist Badge (with Bronze Star), Canadian Parachutist Badge, and the Ranger Tab.

Major General Doyle is married to his wife, Renee.
